Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for helping to keep our children safe and our site secure. A few reminders:

The woodland walk looks amazing at the moment with the bluebells out.


Just a reminder to please keep to the main school paths when dropping off or collecting your child from school. Please do not walk through the woodland walk as this is out of bounds.
