REDUCE CRIME

A number of plain clothed and high visibility patrols, operations and warrants have been conducted across the borough throughout March. These have involved cross border initiative's with our dog section, Surrey Police, BTP and our external partners from Kingston Council. These have resulted in fantastic arrests including Burglary, Drugs (Possession and Possession With Intent to Supply), Weapons and Theft related offences to name a few.

ENGAGEMENT

I am delighted to inform you that our Positive Activity Initiatives (PAI's) are now fully under way and we have seen a fantastic response from members of our communities volunteering to support police initiatives. These have included crime prevention leaflet distribution, weapon sweeps and surveys.

This is an amazing opportunity for members of the public to meet their local neighbourhood teams, discuss what matters most to them and support activities to address those concerns.

We have also implemented our Walk & Talk initiative. Female members of the public patrol for a short period with a female officer to highlight areas of concern on the borough, give their ideas on how we can improve policing Violence Against Women And Girls (VAWG) and discuss what we as an organisation can do to ensure they feel safe when out and instil confidence in reporting offences.

A number of officers attended a wonderful event 'Break the Bias' delivered by Kingston Council at the Guildhall. It was supported by our partners at Natwest and Aspire2Lead, who are determined to support and help local businesswomen overcome any barriers they may be facing through learning, networking and funding.

UNHAPPY WITH AN INVESTIGATION OR HOW YOU HAVE BEEN TREATED?

How to complain, escalate an issue and contact the right person.



VICTIM LEAFLETS

When you report a crime you may be given a victim information leaflet. This has information about the investigating officer, how to get in touch with them, as well as the crime reference number.

If you reported online or on 101 the investigating officer will contact you as soon as they can.

HOW TO GET AN UPDATE ON A CRIME REPORT

If you want to update a crime report, or get in touch with the officer in the case you can do so on our website here:

HOW TO ESCALATE AN ISSUE

If you've reported a crime and you're concerned it's not being progressed, or you are unhappy with the investigation, the next step is to ask to speak to the investigating officer's line manager.

This will be their Sergeant in most cases. You can ask for this through the investigating officer or through updating your crime report as above.

If you are unhappy about the service you have received you can contact your local ward officers and ask them to help. You can contact them at: www.met.police.uk/a/your-area/.

Reporting Crime

In an Emergency

Call 999 if:

- A serious offence is in progress or has just been committed.
- Someone is in immediate danger or harm.
- Property is in danger of being damaged.
- A serious disruption to the public is likely.

If you're deaf or hard of hearing, use our textphone service **18000**.

Or text us on 999 if you've pre-registered with the emergency SMS service.

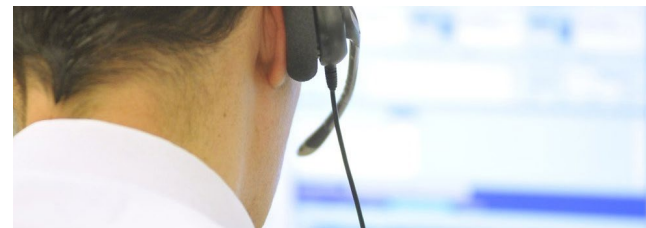
