The number of scooters and motorbikes that continue to go through there as a shortcut is ridiculous. They are constantly speeding well above the 20mph limit (more like 50mph) popping wheelies and I've witnessed at least 3 occasions where there could have been potentially life-threatening accidents. I have 2 small children, and this is a major concern to me as it's just an accident waiting to happen. It needs to either be blocked off fully for all motor vehicles and or cameras put up to catch the people doing this to stop a potential fatality. Also, the new bus stop and lane changes at the bottom of Compton Crescent and more lane roundabout are going to cause a bad accident soon. Drivers when heading from Moor Lane to Bridge Road have to indicate left to get into the left-hand lane after the bus stop at the roundabout. On each occasion, only PCSO Mo Arafat attended, and neither PC KERR nor PC FOLEY, whom I do not recall meeting, nor seeing on patrol. The PCSO told me he is unable to stop those cycling or scootering on the pavement as he is provided no transport, and is always on foot - not even a bike. This appears an absurd and unnecessary limitation upon him. The meetings have given me the impression (rightly or wrongly) that our two ward police officers are not sufficiently engaged with the community of Hook & Chessington North. This actually increased my feeling that local police do not provide sufficient deterrence to potential local criminal activity. This is surely the very opposite of what such meetings are meant to achieve.
